






Yorkshire in Bloom competition

October is also a time to celebrate the harvest. At St Peter's Church, our **Harvest Festival Family Service is on 6th October at 10.45 am.**

Why do we celebrate Harvest?

The Earth is the Lord's and all that is in it...
'He makes grass grow for the cattle, and plants for man to cultivate- bringing forth food from the earth'
Psalm 104, 14

Harvest has been celebrated ever since the first planting of seeds, growing of grain and storing to use in times of shortage. Harvest is a time to thank God for food and farming. We thank the excellent work of global aid agencies and fair trade bodies, who remind us that food production and matters of justice in agriculture are global issues.

We depend so much upon the earth, soil, water and grain to produce good crops and fruit. We also rely heavily on weather conditions to give a good harvest. Climate changes with extreme conditions which we are experiencing more often, can destroy a crop very



quickly. In our society food on our table will have been brought through the contribution of many different people working in a variety of environments. The food chain involves many people - farmers, fishermen, processors and retailers.

A Harvest Service is an opportunity to give thanks, to share and give support for the poor, who are unable to feed themselves, and to thank all those involved in ensuring that food is available for us all to consume, which is essential for life.

It is also an opportunity to pray for the farming community, many of whom are struggling to make a living in today's global economic climate.



Choice, what choice?

If someone had asked you as a child “What do you want to be when you grow up? What would you have said ? Footballer, Tap Dancer, Teacher, Nurse? I remember Bob Monkhouse saying “My family laughed at me when as a lad I told them I wanted to be a comedian, but see, they’re not laughing now!”

My mum said I should have been on the stage...sweeping it!. I have been in a few productions, particularly pantomimes. I once played an evil cowboy called Matt Vinyl in ‘Old Mother Hubbard goes Wild West’. In the recent Driffield Methodist pantomimes I have been cast, not as romantic lead, but an elderly King or an dodderly Bishop, Do you think someone is trying to tell me something?

I did play the son in law of Horatio Hobson in the classic play *Hobson’s Choice*. It set me thinking where did the phrase ‘*Hobson’s choice*’ come from? It originated with Thomas Hobson a livery stable owner in Cambridge, who didn’t want all his best horses being worn out so he offered customers the choice of taking the horse in the nearest stall or taking none at all. Take it or leave it.

I went back to a church where I had been a minister in years gone by. As I met each person memories came flooding back of the shared joys of baptisms, weddings or the sadness of funeral. I chatted with a young lady whose wedding I performed who had later developed Multiple Sclerosis who had introduced me to her friend who was recovering from a kidney transplant who said to me “We’ve gone through lots of ups and downs and some of the things are just *Hobson’s choice* and you’ve just got to get on with life. There are times when we don’t know why things happen but we are blessed because we’ve got love, laughter, friends and faith and they are the things that help us get through!



I’d been reading a book by Rev Frank Topping who was reminiscing about the Hollywood epic films such as ‘Ben Hur’ and that it is best remembered for the famous Roman Chariot race. Driving a chariot was an extremely hazardous adventure and the most dangerous part was cornering. Going down the straight was relatively easy, but turning the corner involved decisions that were quite literally life or death. To overturn a chariot meant almost certain death. When someone is very ill and if they begin to recover, people will say, “They’ve turned a corner!”

A turning point in our lives is when crucial decisions are made. Things happen to each of us, some major events, some minor, some seemingly trivial. But there are times when we don't have any alternative such as bereavement or major illness; they are like *Hobson’s choice*. We don’t know why certain things happen when they are not of our own making. But surely the great secret and great virtue is to accept what we have and to make the best use of the situation. For me the Christian faith teaches us that God is with us through everything each and every day especially in the turning points of our live.

Illegal off-road vehicle use

The use of motor vehicles on 'green lanes' can be an emotive issue and is often a cause for complaint in rural areas. The irresponsible and illegal use of motor vehicles makes the situation worse. There can also be issues with the manner of driving of some individuals.

A Byway Open to all Traffic (BOAT) has proven rights of way for motor vehicles.

Motor vehicle users also regularly use a number of unsurfaced unclassified roads which have possible, but unproven, rights for motor vehicles.

Anyone requiring details about which routes are on the 'list of streets' and 'Definitive Map' detailing such routes should contact the relevant local authority for their area.

Temporary Restriction Orders can be used by local authorities to limit vehicular access which is often done seasonally during the winter months, to prevent damage and erosion to these rights of way with vehicular rights of way.

People who use 'green lanes' should:

- Use only motor vehicular rights of way.

It is illegal to drive on footpaths, bridleways, restricted byways or over open land without the owners permission;

- Make sure you and your vehicle are fully road legal
- Be courteous to other users and landowners
- Travel slowly and in small groups
- Keep to the defined track
- Exercise restraint in the use of unsurfaced routes in wet conditions

I am suffering from illegal off road driving. What should I do?

- Make a note of any registration numbers, descriptions of vehicles and people involved if safe to do so.
- Ensure that vehicular access is limited where possible and which does not interfere with a right of way.
- Report incidents to the police.
- Make your local authority aware if there are ongoing issues with particular rights of way.



Keep hare coursers out of our countryside

Hare coursing is reducing year on year in our area because of action taken by the police and the close working relationship with our rural communities.

Force Wildlife & Rural Crime officer PC Brandon Ward said, "We have done really well together to reduce hare coursing and I don't want that to stop.

"As the harvest is now almost completed we want to remind our communities to report anyone who they suspect is hare coursing in our countryside.

"We have been out across the Force area in recent weeks carrying out patrols to prevent and deter criminals from coming into our area.

"Hare coursers often use old 4x4s and carry lurcher-type dogs in their vehicles. If you see any vehicle being driven in a suspicious way in our countryside please call us and report your concerns.

"We have also seen a number of recent reports of illegal lamping in the area and this too is a wildlife crime we want to bring an end to.

"Poaching is a national wildlife crime priority and illegal 'lampers' are often involved in other criminality such as burglary and vehicle crime.

"We want you to report any suspicious activity to us, particularly in the early hours of the morning if you suspect lamping is in progress. By letting us know as it is happening we can catch offenders in the act.

"Prevention measures should be considered by landowners such as preventing easy access by vehicles to land by using obstacles, gates and other barriers. This is one of the most effective measures that can be taken to frustrate and deter these criminals."

Please call 101 to report any suspicious activity – if you call us we will act.
