

Please help us to prevent the spread of COVID-19 by following **3 Steps To Safety**

The Government has asked all councils to produce such local plans and we have worked with health organisations and other regional and national partners to produce a plan which we hope will help to ensure the **East Riding is a safe place for people to live, work, shop, learn, play, invest and visit with confidence.**

Quite simply, it is all about keeping people safe and saving lives.

East Riding residents have been fantastic in their efforts so far in following Government and Public Health England guidance and in supporting each other, with numerous acts of kindness to help family, friends, neighbours and the most vulnerable members of our society.

How you can play your part

For the plan to work, we need your support and what you need to do is simply follow **3 Steps To Safety** and to encourage your local communities to do likewise.

The **3 Steps To Safety** are: **Prevent. Notice. Act.**

STEP 1: Prevent:

- **Keep your distance** – always follow the latest social distance guidance
- **Wash your hands** - thoroughly washing your hands with soap for at least 20 seconds remains the best personal hygiene precaution

STEP 2: Notice:

- **Be aware of COVID-19 symptoms** – so you can recognise as soon as possible if you or someone close to you has them
 - a high temperature
 - a new, continuous cough
 - a loss or change to your sense of smell or taste

STEP 3: Act:

- **Get tested** – If there is any hint of the symptoms in your household, make sure the person with the symptoms is tested as soon as possible
- **Stay home** – Do the right thing if you and your household need to self-isolate:
 - whether one of you has symptoms and you are waiting for the results
 - whether one of you has tested positive
 - or whether one of you has been in contact with someone who has tested positive

You can request a test by visiting www.nhs.uk/ask-for-a-coronavirus-test or calling 119.

What we are doing

We are providing businesses and other organisations with guidance about appropriate safety measures and we are asking them to tell us as soon as possible if they get any cases or suspected cases so we can support them as quickly as possible in confining the outbreak.

We are supporting the national NHS Test and Trace service at a local level in the East Riding so that individuals and their households are informed as quickly as possible if they need to self-isolate, to avoid passing the virus to others. Our work with local, regional and national partners will also help us to quickly identify people who have been in close contact with those who have tested positive for the virus and to advise them to self-isolate and get tested if they develop symptoms.

#TogetherEastRiding

If we all follow the **3 Steps To Safety**, if we keep doing those simple things like regular and thorough handwashing, respecting social distances and being aware of COVID-19 symptoms in ourselves and others around us, we reduce risk. If we quickly get tested for COVID-19 when we need to and if we self-isolate and stay home when advised to, we reduce risk.

If we don't do these simple things, we increase risk and increased risk will inevitably lead to more infections, more illness and more tragedies for East Riding families and it could lead to a local lockdown and tighter restrictions on all of us.

By doing the right thing and following the **3 Steps To Safety**, we are all helping to keep ourselves, our loved ones and other East Riding residents protected from COVID-19.


Thanks to those of you who have made donations for the plants and cuttings which have been left in Gina's front garden. The donations will go towards the purchase of new plants for next year.

August – The last month of the Summer

My last article in the Bulletin was in March. I advised you all to be always prepared for the unexpected! We were looking forward to the time of Spring – everything coming to life and looking forward to warmer weather, planning for outdoor events and summer holidays. March and April is always a busy time for our church with extra services celebrating Holy Week and we had planned well ahead for Easter.

Who could have predicted what happened during the month of March! The pandemic of Coronavirus hit the world like a storm – Impacting the lives of everyone in the world, and impacting on the world economy not seen in our lifetime. Everyone told to ‘stay at home’ to reduce transmission of the virus, and businesses and schools closed down overnight including all of our churches.

The doors of St Peter’s remained shut for three months, but the church was certainly not closed. With modern technology, zoom services were started fairly quickly and continue every Sunday morning, giving a welcome contact and sharing with our parishioners.

For those parishioners without this technology, we have tried to regularly make contact by telephone and there is a very good free telephone line 0800 804 4884 – Daily Hope giving a collection of hymns, reflections and prayers.

If anyone in the village feels alone or isolated and perhaps feels a need to talk to any of the Ministry team, particularly at the present time, do please contact us. We would be delighted to talk with you.

With the easing of lockdown, St Peter’s was allowed to open, for private prayer only, on Sunday 21st June, following deep cleaning of the church and risk assessment measures put into place to ensuring social distancing is maintained. Private Prayer is held between 2.00 – 3.00 pm every Sunday afternoon.



Further easing of restrictions allowed us to open for a ‘new normal’ evening service on 12th July, following guidelines issued by the government.

As we prepare for August with the many challenges we face in the days and months ahead, our prayers continue for our NHS service and care services put under so much pressure over the last six months, research to find a cure for the virus, and we also pray for all those unemployed – that the economy improves over time and opportunities are developed to strengthen employment. Our faith, prayers, endurance and helping each other will get us through this situation, particularly those who are on their own and have been isolated for a long period.

Looking on the brighter side - August is a time of transition. This is the last month of summer, before the onset of autumn. The weather is generally warm and the gardens are still a blaze of colour – with late perennials and colourful annuals, and the growing season is alive with fruit and vegetable produce. It is also a time for many to travel to favourite destinations, to enjoy the countryside around us, to take exercise and to enjoy meeting family and friends. But whatever you do – stay safe.


Church on the Green




Dear Friends,

Hutton Cranswick Parish Council

Minutes of the meeting of the Parish Council, held on the 24th June, 2020.

The meeting was held remotely via Skype and open to the public. The session commenced at 7.00 pm.

Present: Councillors: Alderton, Holtby, Kelly, Lock, Richardson (in the chair) Sibley-Calder, Mrs Simpson, Swan, Teare, Thompson, Wilkinson, Wilson. Ward Councillors Evison, Owen **Parishioners:** Two.

The Clerk recorded the minutes.

20/161 Apologies: Councillor: Poolford.

20/162 Declaration of Pecuniary and Non-Pecuniary interests

Cllr Sibley-Calder Items 9(c)- 20/169(c) - Non-pecuniary - Owner of neighbouring property.

Cllr Mrs Simpson Item No.15 - 20/175 - Non-pecuniary - HCSRA Committee Member.

Cllr Teare Item No.15 - 20/175 - Non-pecuniary - HCSRA Committee Member.

20/163 Minutes – Resolved – That the minutes of the Annual meeting of the Council held on the 27th May, 2020 and the Ordinary meeting held on the 27th May, 2020 be approved and signed as a correct record (proposed Cllr Swan/seconded Cllr Thompson).

20/164 Covid-19 Community Support Group – Cllr Teare reported the Covid-19 Community Support Group continued to provide assistance in each of the pod areas within the village. The support was now focussed on prescriptions and the occasional shopping. As the lockdown eased, the Group was promoting the service offered by East Riding of Yorkshire Council through the Smile foundation. The Council considered it was an appropriate time for the Group to disband. At a suitable time, the Council would host an event to recognise the hard work and tremendous support the Group has given to vulnerable residents in the village in need of help, due to the restrictions of the coronavirus (proposed Cllr Teare/seconded Cllr Richardson).

20/165 Police – A request from Humberside Police, to provide information on the anti-social use of motorcycles was considered. The Council had reported disturbance from quad bikes that speed up the Main Street. Reports from East Wolds and Coastal and Driffield/Rural for May, 2020 were noted.

20/166 Public Participation:

- a) Paul Lisseter referred to his letter of explanation, sent to Councillors relating, to planning application 20/01548/STOUT: Outline (minute 20/169(c) refers).
- b) Ian Sibley-Calder referred to his letter of objection, sent to Councillors, relating to planning application 20/01548/STOUT: Outline (minute 20/169(c) refers). Ian had declared a non-pecuniary interest.

20/167 New footpath on The Green – Resolved – That decision on the project was deferred to a future meeting, pending resolution of unforeseen legislative constraints arising over the route being over a village green (proposed Cllr Teare/seconded Cllr Alderton).

20/168 Planning Matters – The following decisions were noted:

- (a) **18/00455/PLF:** Erection of 16 dwellings with associated garages and infrastructure, Land and Building, Rear of 99 Main Street, Hutton Cranswick, East Riding of Yorkshire – Full Planning Permission – Approved – 15 Conditions.
- (b) **20/01369/TCA:** HUTTON CONSERVATION AREA - Remove 1 no. Lawson Cypress tree, 1 no. Purple Leaved Plum and smaller mixed species tree group (TG1), to stop the influence of the trees on the soil below building foundation level and provide long term stability to the property (9 Mill Street) , 11 Mill Street, Hutton, East Riding of Yorkshire, YO25 9PU – Tree Works in Conservation Area - Raised No Objections.

20/169 Planning Applications:

- (a) **20/00865/PLF:** Erection of two storey extension to rear and erection of car port to front (AMENDED PLAN AND DESCRIPTION) at Ivy Cottage, 8 Station Road, Hutton Cranswick, East Riding of Yorkshire, YO25 9QZ – Full Planning Permission – **Resolved** – Not to object to the application (proposed Cllr Sibley-Calder/seconded Cllr Wilkinson).
- (b) **20/01370/PLF:** Construction of an equestrian all-weather surface arena and associated works, for private use, at Land North and North West of Four Acres, 27 Orchard Lane, Hutton, East Riding of Yorkshire, YO25 9PZ – Full Planning Permission – **Resolved** – Not to object to the application (proposed Cllr Swan/seconded Cllr Alderton).
- (c) **20/01548/STOUT:** Outline - Residential development (Access to be considered) (Resubmission of 17/03880/STOUT) at Land South of Williamsfield Road, Hutton Cranswick, East Riding of Yorkshire. YO25 9BH – Strategic - Outline Planning Permission (Councillor Sibley-Calder left the call and took no part in the discussion on this application). The Council noted a letter of concern signed by a number of residents. The author be advised to also inform the Case officer of any concerns. Councillors commented on the application in turn – **Resolved** – To object to the application, as the development would (a) exacerbate the existing drainage, surface waste water and foul waste water problems (b) create a significant increase in traffic adding to, at times, severe congestion on Cranswick Main Street and (c) the potential in creating an unmanageable increase in the capacity of the numbers of children attending the School (proposed Cllr Lock/seconded Cllr Kelly).
- (d) **20/01799/PLF:** Change of use of land to create additional vehicle parking area at Manor Farm Shop, Beverley Road, Hutton Cranswick, East Riding of Yorkshire, YO25 9PQ – Full Planning Permission – **Resolved** – Not to object to the application (proposed Cllr Swan/seconded Cllr Wilson).

20/170 East Riding of Yorkshire Community Tree Planting Fund – Cllr Teare agreed to prepare a funding submission for the Council's consideration. On inspection of the Pink Chestnut tree (T25), where a main bough snapped off in May, there was a hollow going down the main trunk. It was noted that the original Tree Protection Plan deemed the tree in poor condition and possibly dangerous. It was **Resolved** that the tree be removed (proposed Cllr Teare/seconded Cllr Mrs Simpson).

20/171 Town and Parish Council Charter Consultation – The Council had no comments, at present.

20/172 Marie Curie Emergency Appeal – The Council recognised the tremendous work carried out by Marie Curie Charity. However, it was difficult to justify making a donation, as any donation made by the Council would be under Section 137. Any spend under Section 137 had to be of benefit to persons within your parish, which would be difficult to prove.

20/173 Litter Bin – Resolved – To approve the replacement of the damaged round litter bin next to the bus stop on Beverley Road, Cranswick at a cost of £377.16 (proposed Cllr Wilson/seconded Cllr Mrs Simpson).

20/174 Annual Governance and Accountability Return 2019-20 – It was noted that the Notice of Public Rights regarding the unaudited Annual Governance and Accountability Return was published on the 14th June, 2020 and documentation was available for inspection, by appointment, for the period commencing the 15th June, 2020 and ending on the 24th July, 2020.

20/175 SRA – It was noted that SRA had been awarded a £5000 Pitch Preparation Fund Grant from the Premier League, The FA and the Government's Football Foundation. Cllr Mrs Simpson reported that the SRA had been able to allow some outdoor activities to resume, following the reduction in the COVID-19 restrictions. The SRA remained closed for all inside activities/events, at present.

20/176 Beverley and North Holderness Internal Drainage Board – The Notice of Public Rights regarding the unaudited Annual Governance and Accountability Return, for the period ending 31st March, 2020, for the Beverley and North Holderness Internal Drainage Board was noted.

20/177 Model Code of Conduct Consultation Local Government Association – The Clerk was to complete the consultation.

20/178 Village Show – Resolved – To approve a press release regarding the cancellation of the 2020 Village Show (proposed Cllr Teare/seconded Cllr Richardson). The cancellation of the Show was due to restrictions of the coronavirus pandemic. The mechanics of delivering a safe and socially distanced event had proved too much for the small volunteer group. It was planned to hold the Village Show in 2021, on Sunday the 25th July.

20/179 In-Bloom – A detailed update submitted by Cllr Mrs Simpson was noted. Team members had maintained their respective areas in both Hutton and Cranswick, whilst observing current Government guidelines. Bluebells and suitable bulbs for areas of Centenary Wood, offered by a Hutton resident, were gratefully accepted and were being planted. No meetings had been held and none were scheduled at present.

Cllr Mrs Simpson was in correspondence with Northern Rail regarding information/guidelines on rail travel.

20/180 Public Sector Bodies (Websites and Mobile Applications) Accessibility Regulations 2018 – The Regulations aimed to ensure reasonable adjustment to websites was made, so websites were accessible to people with various disabilities. From 23rd September 2020, all local councils had to have an action plan and an accessibility statement in place. Cllr Swan presented a proposal to comply with the Regulations. It was **Resolved** to approve the proposal received from Jupiter Web Solution in the sum of £100.00 (proposed Cllr Swan /seconded Cllr Teare).

20/181 Play Area – It was noted that repairs to a number of wooden structures at the play area had been completed. The latest Government advice now allowed play areas to re-open on the 4th July, 2020. The Yorkshire Play Officers Group was producing advice/guidance for the opening of play areas.

20/182 Open Spaces Society – The Open Spaces magazine for Summer 2020 was noted.

20/183 Gatehouse Lake – The minutes of the Gatehouse Lake Committee held on the 29th January, 2020 were received (proposed Cllr Richardson/seconded Cllr Thompson). The draft minutes of the Committee meeting held on the 22nd June, 2020 were noted.

20/184 Flooding problems on Southgate – It was noted that there had been an issue with water escaping from a manhole just prior to the sewage pumping station. This had been caused by an electrical fault on the sewage pumps. Yorkshire Water had repaired the pumps. There had been further flooding on Southgate which was a result of the silting up of the dyke at the trash screen, where the dyke from Hobman Lane meets Southgate. East Riding of Yorkshire Council engineers had taken action to remove the silt. A detailed inspection of the drainage in the area had been undertaken earlier in the year, the result was pending.

20/185 Allotments – Cllr Poolford had recommended that the Council now take action, at its own expense, to make good two adjoining plots which a tenant could no longer maintain to an acceptable standard. The Council noted the history of the management of the two plots over the last two years and recognised the exceptional difficult circumstances suffered by the tenant. The Council was to review its timing of re-entry into an allotment in the event when a tenant was in breach of his/her obligations. It was **Resolved** (a) At the Council's expense, to re-instate the two plots to a lettable condition (b) To give Notice to the tenant and (c) To undertake the annual review of the Tenancy Agreement at the next meeting (proposed Cllr Richardson/seconded Cllr Lock).

20/186 Christmas tree – Resolved – To further explore the provision of an artificial Christmas tree (proposed Cllr Sibley-Calder/seconded Cllr Wilkinson).

20/ 187 Noticeboards – A new noticeboard had been installed at Centenary Wood and a replacement board had been installed at St. Peter’s Church.

20/188 Budget – The latest budget position and bank reconciliation were noted. It was **Resolved** that the update on the budget would be considered as the item after public participation in future meetings (proposed Cllr Thompson/seconded Cllr Richardson).
