Every year at Christmas, parts of Hutton Cranswick sparkle with glittering lights and streets are filled with festive spirit. Although this year looks slightly different, there is still a chance to soak up the seasonal atmosphere.



Dear friends,

This is very different from my usual style, but then we are living through very different times. As I'm writing this, we're in our second week of lockdown and by the time you're reading this, we should be out and back in a Tier. But which one?

On 4th November, the Archbishops wrote a letter to the Nation and I would like to share parts of it with you all. Apologies to those who've already read it.

"These are deeply challenging and difficult times for us all. When we are surrounded by fear and suffering, it can be hard to feel hopeful. This coming winter feels like it will be longer and darker than usual.

"There is a story in the Bible where Jesus and his disciples are caught in a storm. The disciples are understandably terrified as the wind and waves threaten to overpower them. 'Why are you so afraid?', Jesus asks. This year, we too have been caught in a storm which often feels overwhelming. And yet we can look to Jesus, in the boat with us, who calms the storm and comforts us in our fear. We are writing to share our belief that whoever you are, and whatever you happen to believe, you are loved by God. Beyond measure. We also want you to know that we are praying for you, particularly asking that Christ's love will comfort us, calm our fears, and lead our nation and our world through this terrible pandemic.

"There are three other responses that we want to encourage everyone to consider –

First, let's be calm. By only buying what we need and not hoarding, or by reaching out to our neighbours as we did during the first lockdown, we can be stronger together in ways that are impossible if we go it alone. When things go wrong - as they always will with such complex challenges - let us look for good and right ways forward together.

Secondly, let's be courageous. There are many reasons to be fearful at the moment, but the story of Christ calming the waves calls us to give our fears to Jesus and have faith in Him. The British willingness just to get on with things is one of our very best characteristics – let us not be paralysed by fear. We will all need each other's courage in the months to come.

Thirdly, let's be compassionate. So many of us are holding so much pain - our own and the pain of those we love. We will need to be gentle, kind and patient with each other. In the first wave we showed we are a nation of compassion and kindness. Let's dig deep and keep that love for our neighbours strong in this second time of struggle."

"Even though there is much darkness around us, there are also many points of light in the weeks ahead."

The Archbishops included Daily Prayer Themes for the times, which I'm copying for those who would find it helpful.

Sunday – Family, friends and loved ones.

Monday – Schools and colleges, children and young people.

Tuesday – Elderly, isolated and vulnerable.


Wednesday – Businesses, the workplace and economic wellbeing.

Thursday – The NHS and other key workers.

Friday – National and Local government.

Saturday – All who are grieving and all suffering with physical and mental ill-health.

When this letter was written, we had not had the exciting news about two possible vaccines against COVID 19. Edward Jenner pioneered the concept of vaccines, creating the smallpox vaccine



in 1796. Since then, vaccines have saved the lives of countless millions of people across the world.

I am also looking forward to the 'light' of Christmas.

Against our backdrop of a pandemic, I thought about the problems faced by Mary and Joseph in that 'first Christmas'. Mary was pregnant and yet had to travel with husband, Joseph, to Bethlehem, about 90 miles, to be counted at the order of Emperor Augustus.

Transport was limited to a donkey and journey's end meant a very busy town, full of other descendants of King David and Roman soldiers who were organising the counting. After giving birth to Jesus, they had visitors: shepherds and wise men. There was also Jewish law to be followed so a trip to the temple in Jerusalem was necessary. If that wasn't enough, King Herod wanted to kill their son so they had to escape, to Egypt, and remained there until after Herod the Great had died. Then they returned to Nazareth.

"At his birth Jesus was also called Emmanuel. It's a word that appears in lots of carols. It means 'God is with us'. And this is the message of Christmas: in Jesus, God is with us, sharing our darkness and our struggles, bringing comfort and joy. It is the source of our hope.

As the Bible says: "The light shines in the darkness, and the darkness did not overcome it." (John 1:5)
Let us shine in the darkness of this winter.



Dear Friends,

We come again to that wonderful season of Advent and Christmas, where we remind ourselves that Jesus is the whole reason for the season. As Christians we will hopefully gather with our family and friends to celebrate the birth of our Saviour Jesus Christ. As God's only Son, Jesus came to Earth and gave His life so that we may live. His actions and His words remind us that service to others must be central to our lives and that sacrifice and unconditional love must guide us and inspire us to lead lives of compassion, mercy and justice.

The true spirit of Christmas reflects a dedication to helping those in need, to giving hope to those in despair, and to spreading peace and understanding throughout the Earth. Hutton Cranswick Parish Council

Minutes of the meeting of the Parish Council, held on the 28th October, 2020.

The meeting was held remotely via Skype and open to the public. The session commenced at 7.00 pm.

Present: Councillors: Alderton, Holtby, Kelly, Richardson (in the chair) Sibley-Calder, Mrs Simpson, Swan, Teare, Thompson, Wilkinson, Wilson. **Ward Councillors:** Evison and Owen. **Parishioners:** One
The Clerk recorded the minutes.

20/268 Apologies: Councillors: Lock, Poolford.

20/269 Minutes – Resolved – That the minutes of the meeting of the Council held on the 23rd September, 2020 be approved and signed as a correct record (proposed Cllr Alderton/seconded Cllr Thompson).

20/270 Public Participation – Cllr Evison and Cllr Owen gave an update on the discussions held by East Riding of Yorkshire Council and Hull City Council about adopting, a Mayoral Combined Authority status between the two authorities. This would allow the two authorities to collaborate and take collective decisions across the Council boundaries. A Mayor would be elected and have the power to make decisions, about policy and spending, in conjunction with Council Leaders. The government would offer a financial package to support any changes. The suggested areas of work were Transport, Skills, Environment and Flood Risk and Infrastructure and Economic Development. There was some concern over the consultation process. The government had delayed considering submissions for combined authorities, until sometime in 2021.

A representation was made requesting the Parish Council to call for the developer to expedite the completion of outstanding highways works, relating to the Phase 2 Williamsfield Development. It was proposed by Cllr Richardson and seconded by Cllr Sibley-Calder that the matter be escalated to Ward Councillors. Cllr Evison and Cllr Owen agreed to make enquiries on the matter.

20/271 Budget – The latest budget position and assumptions for the predicted year-end outturn which, together with the bank reconciliation, were noted. Rents from tenants of the farming business allotments had been received.

20/272 Annual Estimates and Forward Planning for 2021-22 to 2023-24 – A draft Budget, previously circulated, was considered. It was **Resolved** (a) 2021-22: to increase the provision for the allotments to £3000.00 and approve a revised net budget of £38,340.00, which was to be funded from the Precept and reserves held by the Council and (b) to approve the Budgets for 2022-23 and 2023-24, as presented (proposed Cllr Thompson/seconded Cllr Teare).

29/273 Interim Audit of the 2020-21 Accounts – The Auditor remained satisfied that the accounts and records of the Council continue to be well maintained. There were no significant areas of concern to which the attention of the Council needed to be drawn.

The calculation had been based on an incorrect salary point. The auditor was satisfied this had been resolved and measures were in place to ensure that the correct salary will be implemented by the council's payroll provider. The Clerk had issued a replacement document.

Beech hedge by 3 metres in height due to hedge being overgrown at Somerdene, 32 Main Street, Hutton Cranswick, East Riding of Yorkshire, YO25 9QY – No Objections Raised.
- (d) **20/01799/PLF:** Change of use of land to create additional vehicle parking area at Manor Farm Shop, Beverley Road, Hutton Cranswick, East Riding of Yorkshire, YO25 9PQ – Full Planning Permission - Permission Granted - 2 Conditions.
