An intensive period of work has seen the completion of the restoration (with the aid of my wife, Kate). It has been painted, glass and frames installed, and 6 tubes of silicone sealant used to make it weatherproof.

I have made and installed wooden bookshelves, and the adult sections are now full. There are separate section for teens, young and old children which still have spaces.





The 'Grand' opening on Sunday was attended by many villagers (who also brought books) and the Red Ribbon was cut by Steve Richardson on behalf of the Parish Council. Very fitting as one of our lifelong villagers.

HUTTON CRANSWICK PARISH COUNCIL

Extract from the draft minutes of the meeting held on 26 June, 2024.

24/166 Public Participation – Jonathan Bibb and Andrew Frost introduced themselves as candidates for the East Wolds and Coastal by election on 4 July, 2024.

24/170 Planning Decisions – The following decisions were noted:

- (a) 24/00805/PLF: Erection of single storey extension to rear and single storey porch to front at 24 Hotham Road, Hutton Cranswick Full Planning Permission Granted 2 Conditions.
- **(b) 24/01177/PLF**: Installation of ground mounted solar array at Rotsea Manor Farm, Rotsea Lane Full Planning Permission Granted 3 Conditions.

24/171 Planning Applications:

(a) 24/01358/PLF: Erection of a new pet food preparation area, as an extension to existing storage and manufacturing facility at MJ Pet Foods and Proteins Limited, Cranswick Industrial Estate — Full Planning Permission — Resolved — Not to object to the application.

(b) 24/01689/PLF: Erection of single storey extension to existing detached garage (Revised Scheme 23/02001/PLF) at Moat Lodge, 24 Station Road, Hutton Cranswick - Full Planning Permission — Resolved — Not to object to the application.

24/172 Representatives reports: -

(a) In Bloom – The itinerary for the judging day on 2 July, 2024 was noted. Assistance to do work at the Station from K-Com and work at the SRA from Kings Mill Special School was very much appreciated by the In Bloom Group. Help from Hymers College to do further work at the Station was planned before judging day.



- (b) SRA The Summerfest was a success despite the poor weather. The Committee thanked the Parish Council for funding the minibus service. The floor in the extension to the hall was complete. An energy audit was to be arranged by the Humber and Wolds Action Group to help inform the most costeffective way to heat the hall. A meeting of all the various groups in the village was to be arranged to help diary events with the aim to avoid conflicting dates.
- **(c) Pond** Cllr Sibley-Calder continued to work in controlling the weed in the pond.
- (d) BT Box The BT Box had been refurbished and repurposed into a book exchange. The Box was formally opened on 23 June, 2024 and was now fully stocked with books. The Chairman thanked Cllr Sibley-Calder for transforming what was a derelict phone box to an excellent community asset. The Book Exchange may close over the Winter period.

24/173 Churches Together – Resolved to grant permission for Churches Together to hold a joint Service on The Green on 7 July, 2024 and on 25 August, 2024 and to hold Services on the Green in future years.

24/174 Cross Keys Court – A concern from a resident, that children playing ball games, was becoming a nuisance and was creating potential safety issues, had been referred to East Riding of Yorkshire Council.

24/176 Queen Elizabeth II's Green Canopy Project Woodland at the SRA – The Conservation Volunteers would be maintaining the areas where the trees are planted on 4 July, 2024. There was around 20 trees that needed to be replaced/needed attention.

24/177 Centenary Wood – Resolved to accept the proposal to undertake a Survey and Management Report at a price of £500. A water butt had been installed in the Wood as a source of water for watering the plants on Hutton Road.

24/178 School Crossing Patrol Officer – Resolved that the Service Level Agreement presented by East Riding of Yorkshire Council be approved and signed by the Chairman. The Reserves agreed at the April, 2024 meeting (24/091f) included funding for 2024-25 to cover the estimated charge of £2,921.

24/179 Salt Bins – East Riding of Yorkshire Council was changing the process for inspecting and replenishing salt bins within the East Riding. Parish Councils had to conduct their own inspection prior to the season.

24/180 Temporary goal posts for The Green – Two examples of alternative types of goal posts were noted.

24/181 Net Ball Delivery at the SRA – A request from the Netball Development Officer, Humberside England Netball, for money towards the cost of netball equipment at the SRA, was not approved. It was suggested the request be made to the SRA Committee direct.

24/182 Village Taskforce Walkabout – Cllr Mrs Simpson and Cllr Thompson planned to attend the walkabout on 27 June, 2024.

24/183 Play Area – The repairs identified in the annual inspection report had been completed. The work to the safety surface of the roundabout was unsatisfactory and was to be relayed on 1 July, 2024. The options for the replacement of the Crane Swing was being considered by schoolchildren on the School Council.

24/184 The Green – Resolved that the costed proposal for No Parking signs on The Green, presented by Cllr Alderton, be accepted.

24/185 Questions for Ward Councillors – Cllr Thompson was to meet residents of Southgate to give feedback on the meeting held with East Riding of Yorkshire Council and a representative from Yorkshire Water.


