
the worse off for that.

**Deputy Police and Crime Commissioner for Humberside (PCC)** – Leo Hammond gave a summary of the work the PCC was doing to tackle speeding and road safety at the October Parish Council meeting.



They are supporting Operation Snap to crack down on dangerous driving as well as speeding, by the use of dashcams, and other camera devices to capture dangerous driving in the act. So far since November last year when the scheme was launched about a third of all footage uploaded has resulted in action by the

The Police get involved as Owen's boss is arrested for fraud and Hannah is questioned. A bag of money is found hidden in the house and Hannah and Bailey soon realise that Owen is not who he said he was and they set out to find out who he is and why he's disappeared. Does Bailey hold the key to finding her Dad? It is an exciting book with a lot of twists and turns. Could be confusing for some as it does keep going to the past. It also explores the new relationship between Hannah and Bailey...a little explosive at times! After quite a bit of discussion the group scored it 7 out of 10.

The book for November 26th is The Lamplighters by Emma Stonex.

# Extract from the minutes of the meeting on 23 October, 2024.

**24/250 Public Participation** – Cllr Bucknall asked if there was any feedback on the question whether the Brown Bin collection trial was

to be expanded to properties east of the railway line. Cllr Bibb did not expect the trial would take in any additional properties. East Riding of Yorkshire Council (<u>ERYC</u>) priorities are adult social care and children's services.

**24/252 Questions to Ward Councillors** – Flooding and sewage spills on Southgate – There was no further progress in resolving the issues following the site visit with parish councillors, ERYC and Yorkshire Water. Cllr Bibb agreed to try and progress the matter with Yorkshire Water through officers at ERYC.

#### **24/254 Planning Decisions** – The following decisions were noted:

- (a) 24/02261/PLF: Erection of a two storey and single storey extension to side, following removal of existing shed, erection of a single storey extension to rear, installation of windows to both side elevations, construction of juliet balcony to rear and removal of chimney at Cang Carr Cottage, Watton Carrs Road Permission Granted 2 Conditions.
- **(b) 24/02507/TCA**: HUTTON CONSERVATION AREA Crown lift 1 no. Sycamore tree (T1) to 7 metres, to allow more light into the garden and property; and Crown lift 1 no. Silver Birch tree (T2) by 5 metres (over the roof of the house), due to the branches being in the close proximity to the roof at 8 Church Street, Hutton Tree Works in Conservation Area No Objections Raised.

#### 24/255 Planning Application:

(a) 24/02997/TCA: HUTTON CONSERVATION AREA - Crown lift 2 no. Wild Cherry trees (T1 & T2) to 5 metres and crown thin by 10-15% to allow more light into garden; Fell 1 no. Pine tree (T3) due to 50% crown failure at 17 Mill Street, Hutton – Tree Works in Conservation Area - No objections were raised by the Council.

The Chairman on behalf of the Parish Council congratulated all those involved from the village in the competition. The Judges' comments and plans for 2025 would be considered at the In Bloom meeting on the 5 November, 2024.

(b) SRA – The Committee continued to improve the facilities of the existing building whilst seeking funding streams to enable an extension to be built at some point in the future. Quotes had been received for the installation of a new heating system. Improvements to the disabled toilet, female toilets and a baby changing area were planned for completion by December. Consideration was being given to the installation of an electric car charging point.

Cllr Poolford reported that he had inspected the sports field after the recent heavy rain. The ground appeared to be in good condition with no signs of flooding or saturation.

- (c) Pond The annual clearing of the pond and an inspection of the tree on the island was in hand.
- (d) Book Exchange Recently, the stock of children's books had required to be replenished more regularly than usual; it was hoped that this was an increase in uptake and not anything malicious.

24/257 Deputy Police and Crime
Commissioner for Humberside (PCC) – Leo
Hammond gave a summary of the work the
PCC was doing to tackle speeding and road
safety. The current Community Speed Watch
Scheme operated by Humberside Police was to
be reviewed, aiming to remove some of the
shortfalls of the local policy and some
operational restrictions. A 'Flashing Speed
Sign' or SID's Grant scheme was available,
where the PCC would match fund alongside
Parish and Town Councils at 50% up to £5,000
for new portable flashing speed signs. A
minimum of four locations had to be approved
by ERYC's Traffic Management.

A solar powered 'Community Speed Camera' which could operate 24/7 was being trialled. Once the trial was completed and a policy created, it was intended to roll the cameras out to communities.

Operation Snap was an initiative to crack down on dangerous driving as well as speeding: this was the use of dashcams and other camera devices to capture dangerous driving in the act.

Mr Hammond was working with Safer Roads Humber to increase education regarding road safety in schools and wider communities and agreed to encourage the Police to enforce 20 mph speed limits as 20s, not as 30s.

The Chairman thanked Mr Hammond for his attendance and presentation.

24/258 'No waiting at any time' restrictions – In response to receiving concerns from the public regarding visibility and obstruction, caused by cars parked around the bend on Hobman Lane and the junction of The Green, ERYC had proposed to introduce a new 'no waiting at any time' restriction around the bend at the junction with The Green and had asked for feedback from the Parish Council. Cllr Teare pointed out that the description of Hobman Lane was incorrect and was in fact The Green.

It was unanimously agreed not to support the proposal. It was recognised that at school drop off and collection times, there was increased parking around the school, The Green, Hobman Lane and indeed Main Street, which had made the flow of traffic more difficult, but made most drivers reduce their speed. The new restriction would mean drivers would likely park further down Hobman Lane, Londesborough Road and give an opportunity for some drivers to drive faster close to the school. There was also the questions of how the new restriction would be enforced and whether it was the best use of ERYC's resources?

24/259 Sexual and General Harassment Policy - Resolved to adopt the Policy as drafted and review and update the Risk Register.

24/260 Topic for ERYC's Overview and Scrutiny Team - It was agreed to put forward a suggestion from Cllr Teare on 'How to improve the attitude to local food and that food is produced locally for the benefit of the local communities' as a topic for scrutiny, as part of the 2025-26 municipal year. It was noted by Cllr Bibb the East Yorkshire Local Food Network and Rural Tourism Network promoted the local food and drink sector in the East Riding.

24/261 Centenary Wood – Cllr Poolford had arranged a site visit with a contractor to consider the work identified in the Woodland Management Report, A costed programme of works, to include a proposal for replacement trees, was to be presented to the November 2024 meeting.

**24/262 Remembrance Sunday** – The programme for Remembrance Sunday previously circulated was noted. Cllr Teare would e-mail Councillors seeking support and help in delivering the arrangements.




